Principal's Report

NAPLAN

Today we are sending home student NAPLAN results from the paper tests our Year 3,5 and 7 students completed in May. NAPLAN is just one way we assess our students at Vineyard, with pre and post tests during units, PAT testing twice a year, and consistent observation and monitoring. NAPLAN measures where students are at compared to their year level cohort, but it is also important to recognise the journey each child has travelled throughout the year and particularly focus on the effort they put in.

If you have any questions about your child's results, please see your child's classroom teacher. We want you to understand your child's development and growth, as well as be able to identify areas where they may still need additional help. School Summer Uniform Orders

Thank you to those families that placed orders for summer uniform.

Your orders will be available to collect from the office in Week 10 – **Monday Sept 23**rd – **Friday Sept 27**th. NB Payment upon collection is required.

School Summer Uniform requirements

The wearing of summer uniform officially begins at the start of Term 4.

For the first two weeks students may either wear their summer or winter uniform **but not a combination of both**. After two weeks all students will be required to wear their full summer uniform.

Students are required to wear a hat outside during all activities.

Summer Uniform Requirements are as follows:

Girls Summer Uniform:

- Girls summer dress, bottle green and navy tartan with a white collar and cuffs. <u>All</u> <u>dresses are to be no shorter than knee</u> <u>length</u>
- Green woollen school jumper (must be worn for official school functions)
- School hat, navy with white school logo printed on it
- Short white socks (only required to be worn with black lace up shoes or boots)
- Navy school sandals (no socks required) or black leather lace up shoes with black laces, or black leather elasticised pull on boots that can be polished. In all instances girl's shoes must have a low heel. No high heels will be permitted

Boys Summer Uniform:

- Tailored navy shorts
- Green and white striped shirt (short sleeves)
- Green woollen school jumper (must be worn for official school functions)
- School hat, navy with white school logo printed on it
- Navy socks
- Navy school sandals (no socks required) or black leather lace up school shoes with black laces, or black leather elasticised pull on boots that can be polished.

Summer Sports Uniform for all students:

- Plain navy track pants
- Bottle green polo shirt with school logo printed on it
- Navy rugby shorts with white logo printed on them
- A Burgundy Polo fleece top for boys and airls
- Sneakers with white sport socks with green/white stripes
- Navy Waterproof Jackets are an optional uniform item

All of these items are available for purchase from the uniform shop in the front office.


