Does anyone see me?

The rise in social media is evidence that this question matters. So many of us want to feel noticed. We update our statuses, post pictures, and expose parts of our lives that a decade or so ago would have remained unknown, invisible and unseen.

I'm not against social media, but do you ever wonder why we are so drawn to it all?

I think that it's partly because we have a God-given desire to know and be known by other people. This is certainly a good thing. But I think there is also a lot more we desire, especially as Mums.

We really want to know that the little and routine things in our lives matter. Just having other people know, see and understand helps us cope with the painful, frustrating and at times, overwhelming moments of being a Mum!

We want someone to see us. We desperately want to know that we are not "just" Mums.

But there's also this myth that what is seen by other people somehow adds more value or worth. We want to be seen because if others recognise it, observe it, or are informed about it, it feels more meaningful. We can often think that what is seen or noticed is more significant.

As Mums, we need to be careful of buying into this myth! The unseen does not equal unimportant.

God sees you right where you are.

I was reminded of this many years ago, when I read the following story in the church newsletter on Mother's Day. It spoke to me so I put a copy of it on my fridge at home. To this day, I still refer to it and it continues to inspire me.

A STORY FOR MOTHER'S DAY

A woman once fretted over the usefulness of her life. She feared she was wasting her potential being a devoted Mother. She wondered if the time and energy she invested in her children would make a difference. At times she got discouraged because so much of what she did seemed to go unnoticed and unappreciated. "Is it worth it?" she often wondered. "Is there something better I could be doing with my time?" It was during these moments of questioning that she heard the still, small voice of her heavenly father speak to her heart. "You are a Mother because that is what I have called you to be. Much of what you do is hidden from the public eye. But I notice. Most of what you give is done without remuneration. But I am your reward. Your children are precious to me, even more precious than they

are to you. I have entrusted them to your care to raise for me. What you invest in them is an offering to me. You may never be in the public spotlight but your obedience shines as a bright light before me. Continue on. **Remember you are my servant. Do all to please me". Colossians 3:23-24**

I hope that all of our Vineyards Mums felt loved and appreciated on Sunday. Thank you to our wonderful P&F for organising the Mothers Day stall and giving our students the opportunity to spoil their Mums!

On Wednesday our mainly play team, led by Amy, went through our approval feedback interview with our mainly play coach... and we can now officially start mainly play at Vineyard, as of next week.

Our enthusiastic team consists of Amy Gogoll, Belinda Dare, Shelley Upton, Kylie Jaeschke, Tracy Lane and myself with a wonderful baking team of ladies supporting us from the Mid North Lutheran Ministries. Amy and myself are the only paid staff during this time- everyone else is a volunteer!

mainly play has been a vision for Vineyard for many months now. It is a Christian ministry group for families with pre-schoolers with a focus on story and connection between parent and child. Every week of the school year, play and story, with a little bit of music, along with a lot of laughter and joy combines to create 'a mainly play' session.

mainly play has five core values:

Creativity ... keeping our point of difference by thinking outside of what is traditional.

Connection ... creating genuine spaces for engagement.

Celebration ... a commitment to noticing the extraordinary, even the smallest glimpses, in the ordinary; the remarkable in every day.

Generosity ... our ability to be large hearted, open handed and actively extravagant.

Honour ... honouring diversity and heritage, artists and writers, staff and volunteers, churches and partners, and God.

We are really excited about our mainly play officially starting this coming Wednesday. If you have preschool children we would love for you to come along and join with us this week in the Cottage from 9.30am until 11 am. If you know someone who might be interested, please tell them about our mainly play. Further information is available from Amy, or any of

our team. We thank Amy and our wider team for all of the work they have already done behind the scenes to get us to this stage. We also thank our volunteer families who came to our practise sessions and gave us their feedback and encouragement.

We pray God's blessings on this new ministry and outreach opportunity for our community.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing went well this week for all of our Year 3, 5 and 7s. We opted to go with the paper version again this year which meant we weren't involved in technical issues some schools encountered, but we will start online trials soon in readiness for 2020 when all students across Australia will move to the online version. I want to say how proud our staff are of all of our students -who gave it their best and kept calm and settled throughout the week; and that includes the students who combined classes for a range of different learning activities while testing was on. Thanks to our teachers for their flexibility and patience this week as the timetable was constantly interrupted.

As you know, NAPLAN is just one of the formal ways we assess our students here at Vineyard, and it provides us with a snapshot of knowledge, skills and ability to apply them at this point in time. Some of our other assessment strategies include PAT Testing, running records, pre and post testing, observations, dialogue and work sample analysis. We use assessment data in 3 ways... assessment OF learning, assessment AS learning and assessment FOR learning. Assessment data allows us to plan to extend your child's learning by opportunities for where your child is at, recognising that students have individual learning journeys and progress at different rates. NAPLAN provides handy comparison data with state and national averages, however it's only part of the picture. An important factor to remember when looking at all assessment data is the journey travelled i.e.: to identify whether both a gifted child and one who struggles are challenged to progress further, no matter where their starting point is.

Formal reports will come home at the end of this term, but you are welcome to discuss your child's progress (academically, socially, and behaviourally) at anytime with their teacher.

We believe Education works best when there is a partnership between school, students and parents, and we encourage you to come and chat about the curriculum, our learning opportunities and your child.

SERVING IN OUR COMMUNITY

You will have noticed our northern garden beds have had a tidy up with weeds out and new bark laid. A big thank you to Mr Goodwin, Mr Jervies and all of the students who helped us with this. 
