BLESSED to be a BLESSING

I know that I have been greatly blessed. Perhaps you have too. So many of us have been given so much: material goods, adequate incomes, families, friends, jobs, homes. And that's just for starters. If you're a Christian, then whatever your circumstances, you've been given the greatest gifts: faith, hope and love. And you have been blessed with the means of grace and the hope of glory. If you have Christ, you have been given everything that is eternally worthwhile. So the big question is "Why?" Why have I, why have you, been so blessed? The answer to that question is found in Genesis 12:2-3.

"I WILL BLESS YOU, YOU WILL BLESS OTHERS"

, "Blessed to be a blessing." This idea is actually one of the most crucial principles in the whole Bible. The concept of "blessed to be a blessing" teaches us something very basic about God's expectations for each of us. It's not just about Abram in the opening verse of <u>Genesis 12</u> where the Lord tells Abraham, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you." Abraham went, and God blessed. But this isn't the whole story. For that you need to read the rest of the sentence. Here's how it continues: "I will bless you," God says to Abraham, "and you will be a blessing. . . . and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you" (<u>Genesis 12:2-3</u>).

God's promise to bless Abraham is accompanied by a further explanation. His blessing of Abraham is just the first step in a much bigger plan to extend that blessing through Abraham to all the earth's peoples. The blessings God gives us are intended to be shared with all, beginning with the inestimable blessing of salvation from sin and including all the other good things the Lord has given to us.

Let's make this personal for just a minute. Take stock of your own life. Think about everything that God has given you, all the blessings he has poured out, material or spiritual. Most of us have far more than we usually acknowledge. Compared to the world's truly poor, I am wealthy beyond belief, and you probably are too. Do we imagine that we have been given so much simply to enable us to live comfortable, even luxurious lives while so many throughout the world are suffering?

Everyone needs a blessing. We all need to be encouraged, edified, complimented, and appreciated, and you have the ability to bless others. Be thankful that God not only blesses you, but that He has made you a blessing. We all get weary at times and need other people to let us know that we are valuable and appreciated.

I believe God blesses us so we can be a blessing—not only in a few places but everywhere we go. Look for people who are needy and bless them. Share what you have with those who are less fortunate than you

are. Remember, everyone needs a blessing—even the successful people who appear to have everything.

When you live to meet needs and encourage those around you, you will find "joy unspeakable" in the process (see 1 Peter 1:8 KJV).

I wonder if we're in danger of so concentrating on the top line – all the good things God has given us – that we forget the bottom line of the verse, and the bottom line is this: we have been blessed to be a blessing.

Prayer Starter: Father, I am so grateful for Your blessings in my life, and I am also grateful that You have enabled me to be a blessing. Help me reach out to others every day and focus on adding to their encouragement. In Jesus' Name, Amen.


