## From the Principal

Welcome back! I always enjoy the start of the year when we welcome back staff, students and families and plan all of the exciting things we will do for the year. This year is no exception and we look forward to exciting learning opportunities, sporting events and fun activities.

### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS

In the week before students started, our staff have been engaged in Professional Development activities. On Monday all staff gathered together to set the theme for the year, "Kindness Counts!," and work through our internal policies, procedures and administrative matters. This day is always packed full of information but it helps us to revise emergency procedures and chat through ideas for how the year will work.

On Tuesday we met with the staff from St John's Eudunda and Good Shepherd Angaston to look at the film: "Most Likely to Succeed." The film discusses how the paradigm of education has changed and presents an alternative model of engaging students and developing skills for the future. It certainly gave us something to think about and challenged some of our current practice. We also discussed what we want our partnership to look like this year – focussing again on Inquiry, transdisciplinary units and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths taught in an integrated way). We were joined for the day by Rod Wearn and Andrew Bradtke (Education Leaders from Lutheran Education South North West). This is the third year we have worked as a collaborative cluster and we are enjoying the strong relationships with staff from these schools. It has been great to be able to plan and bounce ideas with teachers of a similar grade level or role, and these relationships go well beyond the formal workshop days.

On Wednesday, we went to Golden Grove Lutheran School to join teachers from St John's Eudunda, Maitland Lutheran School, and Golden Grove (of course) for a Maths workshop. We learnt a lot about brain research and how inquiry creates deeper learning. We participated in our own Maths Inquiry tasks and delved into digital provocations. You will see some of these provocations in our Maths units at Vineyard and we hope they will engage our students on a deeper level.

### NEW CAPTAINS

Next week we will include some information about our new School Captains: Mahli, Leah, Ben and Sarah. They have already met with me this week and we have discussed some of the exciting ways they have thought of to serve in our Vineyard community. This term we will attend two Student Leadership workshops: One at Redeemer Lutheran School about Servant Leadership (with around 80 students) and also the GRIP Student Leadership conference at the Adelaide Entertainment Centre (with around 1000 students). I have already seen them interacting with our new students and making them feel welcome, and look forward to seeing some of their other ideas put into action very soon.

## **KINDNESS AWARDS**

As part of our yearly theme, this year we have decided to change the focus of our Student of the week awards to reflect our 10 Lutheran Values: Love, Justice, Compassion, Forgiveness, Service, Humility, Courage, Hope, Quality and Appreciation (all of which are attributes of Kindness). You will notice the certificates look different, but we will still be looking for students in each class who display these attributes. Come along to assembly each Friday at 2.45pm and help us congratulate the worthy recipients.

That making learning visible through displays, assessment and timely feedback engages learners in continual reflection and consolidation which promotes new questions and deeper learning

Learning happens in and beyond the classroom. The environment (both inside and outside) has a critical part to play in learning therefore it needs to inspire, be appropriately resourced, and learners given choice about when and how it is used.
